Greater Baltimore Jewish Community Study

Survey calls are being conducted at random through May 2010.

Every 10 years, THE ASSOCIATED undertakes a thorough study of the Baltimore Jewish community to see what's changing. For the next decade, the information gleaned from this study will inform the planning and strategies for Baltimore's synagogues, Jewish schools, THE ASSOCIATED and its constituent agencies. The specialists undertaking the 2010 study will be calling randomly selected landlines and cell phones through May to complete 1,200 interviews in the Baltimore area. The study takes 18 minutes and in addition to collecting demographic information, it will examine and measure Jewish connections and affiliations, changing household structures, rates of intermarriage, and assess social service issues related to poverty, seniors and families in crisis.
